The Council began the year with 6 members. Vacancies were advertised and in September 2012 the Council appointed Mr Peter Gartside to the vacant Appley Bridge Ward Councillors post. In October 2012 Mrs Davina Hanlon resigned as Appley Bridge Ward Councillor. There are now once again 2 Parish Council Vacancies, one in each ward. POLICING - PCSO Benson continued his sole

(the same as the previous year). The Parish Council accounts for the year ending 31 March 2012 were audited by BDO Stoy Hayward with no matters arising.

PLANNING - The Council is notified of all planning applications within the Parish and is able to submit comments, observations and objections when necessary but, has no power of direction or decision making in these matters. 47 Planning Applications have been dealt with by the Parish Council during the year, in comparison to 57 applications last year. E.g. An application for the erection of 3 wind turbines at Stoneleach Farm, Toogood Lane, Wrightington. The Council and residents objected to the proposals on similar grounds to those submitted when the application for a turbine was received at Raby Fold Farm (full details can be found in the Annual Report on the Parish Council website). This application was subsequently withdrawn. The WRAT Pack now find themselves fighting a further planning application for 1x 90m high wind turbine at Hesketh House Farm. Councillors and the Clerk attended a consultation by Stratus Environmental Ltd at St James's Church Hall in February 2013 on these proposals. Once again strong objections to this proposal, similar to those on previous applications, have been submitted to the Borough Council. The Council, objected strongly, though unsuccessfully, to the application for change of use of The Brookhouse Public House to a dwelling. The Council has recently objected to proposals submitted to Wigan Borough Council for further development at Herons Wharf. The Council has had detailed preliminary discussions, with residents attending Parish Council Meetings, on the proposals to relocate Wigan Athletic Training facilities on land adjacent to, and to the rear of, Wrightington Country Club. A response will be

responsibility for Policing this large geographical area admirably and to the best of his ability. In October he reported the appointment of PC Beverley Lodge as the new Community Beat Manager responsible for this Policing area. PACT issues can now be raised at the Coffee Mornings held at Mossy Lea Village Hall which PCSO Benson and PC Lodge try to attend or at the PACT Meetings which have again been reinstated in the Parish, on a less frequent basis and rotationally at the Village Halls. The new 101 telephone number introduced for nonemergency calls is reportedly working well.

VILLAGE HALLS - Christmas Trees were erected at both Village Halls. The Parish Council installed flag poles holders at both Village Halls. Flags were flown to mark the Oueen's Diamond Jubilee, Armed Forces Day, and Remembrance Day.

**APPLEY BRIDGE** - The Council sought the advice of the contractor and determined that the damage to the existing floor from tap dancing classes was so significant that funds would need to be accumulated from both village halls to try to pay for the purchase and installation of a completely new engineered oak floor. Applications were submitted to Villages in Partnership and to County Councillor Ms Evans to assist with the removal of the existing false ceiling in the kitchen and replacement with a more modern ceiling together with associated electrical and redecoration work. Both bids were successful and the work undertaken has made a tremendous difference to the kitchen facility in the village hall. The Parish Council completed this work by upgrading the radiator and lighting, choosing light fittings to complement the age of the building. Once complete the Council asked the
