WRIGHTINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

At the Meeting of the Council of the Parish of Wrightington held on Monday 16 June 2014 at Mossy Lea Village Hall at 7.30pm the following were present:

OPEN FORUM

(At this point in the Meeting members of the public present can report, ask questions, raise issues and make observations on parish matters or items appearing on the Agenda. Reports will also be received from the Police, District and County Councillors if attending – Once open forum is closed the Chairman will only suspend standing orders to allow public participation in extreme circumstances.)

<u>Public Present</u> – The first street light on Chisnall Avenue is obscured by overgrown vegetation. The footpath sweeper has been seen in the village over the past 2 weeks however, the work has not been completed. Councillor Johnson reported a response from Mr Concannon at West Lancs. BC stating that footways should be swept every 6-8 weeks whilst roads should be every 13-16 weeks however, a number of things such as the weather, lack of manpower and maintenance of machinery, can affect these frequencies. It has been suggested that Councillor Johnson may wish to attend a site meeting with Mr Peters, Streetscene, West Lancs. BC. Grass has been cut and test digs completed at Mossfields. <u>PCSO Benson</u> – Reported 0 crimes in June and 9 in May as follows: 3 drive offs from the BP garage, 1 individual stopped recently for drugs, 1 physical/verbal altercation between a husband and wife, 1 assault with injury, 1 burglary on Mossy Lea Road, 1 possession of cannabis from a vehicle stopped on Hall Lane – given a warning and a fixed penalty, 1 criminal damage at a factory off Appley Lane North. PCSO Benson was asked if he could find out the legal width of a farm vehicle on public roads.

- 22. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST Members were asked to consider any personal/prejudicial interest they may have to disclose in relation to matters under discussion at the Meeting. No declarations were made at this point in the Meeting however, should a Councillor feel he has any interest in later matters he/she will declare it at that point.
- 23. MINUTES The Minutes of the Annual Meeting of Parish Council held on Monday 19 May 2014 had been circulated in advance of the Meeting, were accepted as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

25. CORRESPONDENCE/INFORMATION ITEMS

- d) Enquiry from a resident of Dobson Close regarding becoming a Parish Councillor The author of the letter was present to observe, and possibly submit an application for the vacant post. The Council will discuss any application in due course.
- e) Email resignation of Councillor McRae West Lancs. BC will be informed and, once due process has been followed, the Parish Council will advertise the vacancy.
- f) Late items received which may require discussion/action/observations i) Request for a Donation from Appley Bridge Pensioners Social Club Resolved: £100 at the next meeting.
 ii) Parish Council website The Clerk is liaising with the new web co-ordinator and trying to obtain web hosting and domain name information from Mr Taylor.

26. HIGHWAYS AND ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

- Japanese Knotweed on Mossy Lea Road, near Tunley Lane, is spreading.
- Councillor Johnson continues to pursue the issue of inadequate road and footway sweeping.
- The Council will await completion of drainage works on Mossy Lea Road.
- Public footpath signs need re-setting for footpath 23B Mossy Lea Road, opposite Diglake Farm and footpath 19 Raby Fold Farm driveway.
- The rusty litter bin near the bus shelter at the junction of Mossy Lea Road and Chisnall Avenue, which has been reported several times, still needs replacing.
- Wood chips have been left on the playing field following the removal of tree stumps.

28. ANNUAL NEWSLETTER – Draft for Amendment/Approval – Resolved – that the draft Newsletter is approved and should now go to print for distribution in July/August.

29. VILLAGE HALLS

 $\underline{MOSSY LEA}$ – Work to refurbish the notice board is complete – costing less than £200 for the materials and saving approx. £1000.00 on the price of a new one. Once confirmation is received the joiner will be contacted to fit the new kitchen units to be chosen by the Clerk and Councillor Mrs Burton.

<u>APPLEY BRIDGE</u> – The contractor has removed the ivy from the bottom of the trees and the ivy is now dying. The trees will be pruned at the end of the season. The Village Hall Committee is not particularly happy with the suggestion of a metal fence at the edge of the grass and suggested planting shrubs or hedges as an alternative. It was suggested that planted troughs could be attached to a metal fence. This matter will be given more thought.

- **30. PLANNING** Observations on the following applications are as detailed:
- 1) 2014/0364/FUL Proposed extension to and resurfacing/linemarking of existing car park to allow (Case 1548046) patients to park nearer main hospital wards/departments. Wrightington Hospital,

(Case 1548046) patients to park nearer main hospital wards/departments. Wrightington Hospital, Hall Lane, Wrightington – **No Objections.**

2) 2014/0395/FUL One pair of two storey semi-detached houses. Land adjoining 51 Skull House (Case 1548055) Lane, Appley Bridge – No objections in principle provided the plot is large

enough for a pair of semi-detached dwellings and that this would not constitute overdevelopment of the site.

- 3) 2014/0513/FUL Extension and alterations to existing bungalow. Increase roof height by 0.8m to provide first floor accommodation. Rear two storey gabled extension (projection of 0.4m) Extension/alterations to existing garden room. Construction of a new front porch. High Fields, Robin Hood Lane, Wrightington No Objections.
- 4) 2014/0524/FUL Proposed two storey rear extension to delivery area. Northern Divers Ltd, Northern Divers Ltd, Northern Divers Building East Quarry, Appley Lane North, Appley Bridge No Objections.
- 5) 2014/0470/FUL Erection of one detached house. New vehicular/pedestrian access. Land between (Case1548088) 321 and 325, Mossy Lea Road, Wrightington The Parish Council object to

these proposals as they would result in an overdevelopment of the piece of land in question. Also, the proposals would be a development of agricultural land in the Green Belt thereby changing the status of the land. Furthermore, the proposals would landlock the piece of land at the rear of the development site which is also owned by the applicant. Access to the applicants land could then only be achieved by demolishing a second property which the applicant owns on Broadhurst Lane which is totally unsuitable for any heavy plant and machinery needed to develop the landlocked piece of land.

- 6) 2014/0475/FUL Construction of new dummy mansard roof with new entrance porch. The Waters (Case 1548075) Edge, Mill Lane, Appley Bridge No Objections.
- 7) 2014/0545/FUL Erection of part two storey part single storey extension to rear and side following demolition of existing extensions and alterations to access and front driveway, boundary wall. Thornleigh, 1 High Moor Lane, Wrightington No Objections.
- 8) 2014/0559/FUL (Case 1548074)
 (Case 1548074)
 Variation of Condition No. 12 imposed on planning permission 2010/1161/COU to allow the conversion of the building to be implemented strictly in accordance with the measures specified in the structural survey dated 19 May 2014 and received by

the Local Planning Authority on 27 May 2014. South Tunley Farm, Tunley Lane, Wrightington – **No Objections.**

- 9) 2014/0422/FUL Variation of condition No.4 imposed on planning permission 2013/0158/FUL to allow surface water to be connected to the existing system via a water attenuation system. Variation of Condition No. 2 imposed on planning permission 2013/0158/FUL to allow amendment to approved plans as shown on plan reference 3080-14-10E received by the Local Planning Authority on 23 May 2014. Land to the rear of 9-17 Broadhurst Lane, Wrightington The Chairman, Councillor Hodgkinson, left the room during these discussions. Councillor Mrs Burton took the Chair. All Parish Councillors declared an interest in this application as a result of the close working relationship they have with the applicant. No discussions took place, no comments will be submitted by the Parish Council.
