WRIGHTINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

At the Meeting of the Council of the Parish of Wrightington held on Monday 20 April 2015 at Appley Bridge Village Hall at 7.30pm the following were present:

Councillors: Mr F Hodgkinson (Chairman), Mrs J Burton, Mr P Gartside, and Mr J Clinch.

OPEN FORUM

(At this point in the Meeting members of the public present can report, ask questions, raise issues and make observations on parish matters or items appearing on the Agenda. Reports will also be received from the Police, District and County Councillors if attending – Once open forum is closed the Chairman will only suspend standing orders to allow public participation in extreme circumstances.)

Public Present – Reported that there had been quite a considerable turnout at the recent residents meeting. It was reported that the Parish Council had not directly received a copy of the letter detailing the residents meeting however a copy had been emailed by a concerned resident of Appley Bridge to the Clerk. It was confirmed that the Parish Council are familiar with the originator of the letter, Ms Bradbury, who has been to a Parish Council Meeting to try to influence the Parish Council on a number of matters about which the Parish Council could do nothing. At the residents meeting Ms Bradbury reported how she was able to help the community and what she was going to do. Councillor Mrs Burton suggested that the land in question near the school could be donated to the school however Ms Bradbury said that the school could not afford the land and the work which went with it. As far as the Parish Council are aware no plans have as yet been submitted for her proposals in the Parish. It was confirmed that the proposal is to create an access almost opposite Skull House Lane, following the route of the public footpath, where a car park will be created at the rear of the houses on Appley Lane North providing parking for rail-users. Further up this route towards the school a car park will be created for parents and visitors to the school. Those present have deduced that the landowner is looking to create an access road from Appley Lane North/Skull House Lane through to Finch Lane the creation of which will open up access to Escalibur land for development. The proposals also indicate that double yellow lines will be put in place on Finch Lane. It was confirmed that the Parish Council has been trying for 20+ years to deal with parking problems in Appley Bridge. The most appropriate piece of land for use as a car park is the piece of land adjacent to the railway. This land was once owned by British Rail but was sold some considerable time ago to Maguire's. Both the Parish Council and the residents of Appley Bridge believed that the PAD would be handed over to the Community once transportation of goods ceased, this would have been the ideal location for a commuter's car park. This never happened and the parking problems are now horrendous. Many of the residents present suggested double vellow lines should be in place for the whole length of Appley Lane North. Those present are of the opinion that there is a real threat to Green Belt Land in Appley Bridge from this developer claiming that parking problems can be resolved. The Clerk read aloud Mr Barrett, LCC Officer's, letter informing the Council that, as a short term solution LCC are looking at installing intermittent lengths of double yellow lines which will effectively create passing places however, in the long term the letter suggests the creation of off-street parking as part of a s106 agreement with a developer in connection with future developments. The Parish Council, and the residents present, were very unhappy and disappointed with the implications in this letter and will respond to Mr Barrett expressing their disappointment. A resident who had delivered the letters relating to the residents meeting on behalf of Ms Bradbury expressed her embarrassment at having been 'taken in' by Ms Bradbury's plans to set up a residents association. A representative of the school confirmed that All Saints School has refused to work with Ms Bradbury because she appears to tell different people different things. The letters received indicate that if the school do not agree to the parking provisions Ms Bradbury is proposing, arrangements will be made to fence off the land they currently use for parking. Ms Bradbury would have liked to have the school, the Church and the Parish Council on board however her actions to date have alienated them. Ms Bradbury said that the school had approached her to alleviate their parking problems. In order to do this a significant amount of trees opposite Skull House Lane were removed very quickly as Ms Bradbury said that a roundabout would be created and, in order to pay for the work required to create car parking, development of Escalibur Ltd land would need to be undertaken. This is totally out of the question and the residents of Appley Bridge do not want to see Green Belt land sacrificed to developers. There is serious concern that any development of this type would open the flood gates for further development and erosion of the Green Belt. It was confirmed that there is a report by Escalibur Ltd on West Lancs. BC website included as part of the Green Belt Study in connection with the

release of Green Belt Land in Appley Bridge to alleviate parking problems and to make several junctions safer. The Parish Council will question the status of this report. Councillor Mrs Burton confirmed that, if or when Escalibur submit a planning application, the residents would like to call a public meeting the Parish Council will support them.

Highway Services, LCC, in relation to parking concerns on Appley Lane North, received via Rosie Cooper MP – Following discussions at the commencement of this meeting there is extreme concern about the final paragraph of Mr Barrett, LCC Officer's letter which implies that the long term parking problems in the Parish could be alleviated by the creation of some off-road parking as part of a s106 agreement on future development in Appley Bridge. Both the residents and the Parish Council are concerned that the possible future development referred to is likely to be on land, managed by Escalibur Ltd, which is Green Belt Land. <u>Resolved</u>: The Parish Council will question the long term solution proposed by Mr Barrett and will ask West Lancs. BC planning, what significance is given to the Report from Excalibur Ltd on the release of Green Belt Land in Appley Bridge for development.
- h) Notification that £227.72 CIL money is available for transfer to the Parish Council to be spent in accordance with CIL Regulation 59C – Following enquiries it has been determined that CIL money can be spent on white-lining the car park at Appley Bridge Village Hall.
 <u>Resolved</u> – The Parish Council will accept this money and use it to mark out the car park at Appley Bridge Village Hall. A report will be prepared at the end of the financial year to indicate the amount of CIL money received and how it has been spent.

The Council felt disappointed that the Borough Councillors had not involved the Parish Council in any discussions as to the location. The defibrillator will be located outside Pesto at the Dicconson Arms. The Parish Council think it would be a good idea to try to locate another defibrillator in the Mossy Lea Ward, possibly near the Pensioners Hall, which would serve the Pensioners Hall, the Church, Rivaj, the Industrial Estate. Councillor Mrs Burton agreed to speak to Huws Grey to see if they will sponsor the purchase of a defibrillator for Mossy Lea
